

#### Church Windows – Part 3 by Deacon Greg Why does this window project cost so much?

As we said before, our windows are unique. The work is labor intensive. We said we chose Window Creations for this project because they gave us a reasonable solution. They will remove and replace most, if not all of our current stained glass since it is in very bad shape. Window Creations original quote of \$789,000 was sent to the Diocese for review and approval as required by diocesan policy. We received their approval on March 1. Our Finance Council asked us to find ways to reduce the project cost. To honor their request, we're working with Window Creations on the following, and possibly other options.

#### Option 1 - Original quote \$789,000 includes

- Storm windows
- Removal of all stained glass with new Art Glass windows with digital glass printing designs which include scenes of our choosing and replicating the current window art design,
- Refurbishment of the sacristy Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary stained-glass windows.

#### Option 2 – Original quote – Art Glass only

- Same as Option 1 but use Art Glass for the sacristy Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary windows instead of refurbishing the stained glass.
- This should reduce project costs due to less labor for stained glass work.

#### Option 3 – Original quote – Art Glass Only/No scenes

- Art glass for all windows
- Use current window art design. No new scenes.
- This should reduce costs due to less labor related to stained glass work and less scene design work.



#### 20-February-2024 Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes

**Beginning time:** 7:15 PM and Ending **Time:** 9:00 PM

Attendance: Present – Joe Coleman, John Gabel, Andy Brickner, Bob Swartzmiller, Brad Zoeller, Allen Reinhart, Margaret Steyer, Alicia Swartzmiller, Sr. Marcia Boes, Dan Borer, Deacon Greg Siebenaller. Absent – Lucas Brickner, Tim Galvin, Tim Kimmet, Norma Tiell, Steve Kimmet, Fr. Tim Kummerer.

**Parish Mission** – Sr. Marcia reminded everyone of the Mission on Sunday 2/25 and Monday 2/26 @ 7 PM. Steve Angrisano will present on both dates: two different presentations with one theme - "Bread of Life". Mission is also a Eucharistic Minister of Holy Communion (EMOHC) recommissioning opportunity. All members are encouraged to attend both nights.

**Parish Survey** - Dan Borer and Deacon Greg provided an update. MLAD to produce the survey mailing. Sending mailing with a letter, 3 response cards and return/stamped envelope to about 1,150 households. The mailing goes out in time for parishioners to receive them on or before 3/8. Survey runs from 3/9 through 3/24.More response cards will be available in the pews at weekend Masses. Online survey through SurveyMonkey (SM). Prefer to have responses made through SM as it automatically records all responses into a survey database. All manual responses will be entered into the SM digital database. All responses are anonymous. Reviewed the survey's 6 questions. Survey data and analysis will be the basis for the next parish assembly (synod) to be held later this year (probably September 22).

**Business Manager Position** – Deacon Greg reviewed current plans including plans to shorten the application and hiring timeline. Council discussed preferences for a successful candidate including, but not limited to being a practicing catholic, a member of the parish, having a heart for the poor, someone who focuses as much on mission as the finances, and able to have difficult conversations with compassion.

**Church windows** - Diocese has not yet communicated to us their approval or disapproval of our window project. Council agrees the window project is necessary. A request was made that we look at ways to reduce the project cost as the project does not advance our mission. Leadership will explore options and discuss with the company to have options and related costs by the next meeting.

Cemetery parish memorials - Discussed options and related costs. Finance Council members shared their concern for the total cost of the project. Council agrees the memorials are important. As with the windows project, spending the amounts we've discussed for the memorials does not advance our mission. The Council discussed the cost issue and concerns about ongoing maintenance. The Council discussed possible options and how we can involve our parishioners, especially those who are masonry or construction contractors, to come up with a design for each place that limits costs to a reasonable level. We should talk with them to at least see what they have to offer and the related costs and benefits. The council discussed seeking donations to cover costs. Agreed to continue the discussions to come up with a reasonable solution.








# Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

My friend and fellow pastor, Father Paul, noticed unsightly, overgrown trees near his parish church. He asked the maintenance crew to cut back the growth, which they happily did, telling him the trees would be much healthier and even fuller after a good pruning. A few days later, Father Paul received a letter from an irate man in the neighborhood who wrote, "Jesus would never prune trees like that. He loves trees, unlike you."

I suspect that the neighbor was not familiar with this week's Gospel in which Jesus says of his Father, "He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit" (John 15:2) I don't mean to pick too much on that fellow. He was perhaps ignorant of arboriculture. But I'd wager his main confusion was the pruning and removing quality of God's love. That confusion afflicts us all to some degree, doesn't it? It is just so darn easy to react negatively when God cuts something out of our lives and assume it's not his work at all. In the moment, all we see is the loss, and not the loving desire for future flourishing.

The cross is the great pruning of Christ's body. Jesus' rising is the brand-new growth. It is God's promise to us that all the painful pruning in life is leading us somewhere beautiful. What has been cut back or out in your life? A friend, an opportunity, a sense of certainty, a job, health, a relationship? This week, offer those dry branches to the one who lovingly prunes us in order to make our lives burst with verdant growth.
