19-March-2024 Joint Pastoral/Finance Councils Meeting Minutes

Beginning time: 7:15 PM and Ending Time: 9:00 PM

Attendance: Present – John Gabel, Alicia Swartzmiller, Allen Reinhart, Margaret Steyer, Brad Zoeller, Bob Swartzmiller, Sr. Marcia Boes, Dan Borer, Steve Kimmet, and Deacon Greg Siebenaller. Absent – Andy Brickner, Joe Coleman, Lucas, Brickner, Tim Galvin, Tim Kimmet, Norma Tiell, Fr. Tim Kummerer.

Solar Eclipse Plans – Reviewed and discussed plans to lock the church building and block off the church parking lots and cemeteries during the eclipse weekend. Asked for help from council to put up/take down ropes over the course of the weekend.

Parish Survey - Reviewed status of the survey which ends on March 24.

Church Windows Project – The parish received Diocesan permission to go ahead with the project. Deacon Greg shared with Council a summary of the conversation between Fr. Tim and the parish leadership team (PLT). They discussed the council's concerns about the cost of the project, options for reducing the cost to free up funds for mission-related projects. Steve shared his conversations with Window Creations about cost saving options. Savings may be possible, but not a large amount of savings. The PLT, and any Council member wishing to take part, will meet with Fr. Zach Brown to discuss our plans and the Diocesan arts and environment requirements. The final artistical design must be approved by Bishop Thomas before we go ahead with the project's art design.


The Council discussed the cost and art design of the project. The consensus was the building is a church. It needs windows that are beautiful and are fitting for a church. A question was asked about if the Diocese's approval of the large expenditure on the windows means we'll be continuing as a parish. We should not read anything into their approval other than they believe we have enough funds to pay for the project.

Side entrances – Dan Borer gave an update on using Frenchtown stained glass to create new partitions at both side entrances. This should be finished by June 29.

Parish Mission – Reviewed what we did well and what we can improve. Went Well - The consensus was that it went well, was a wonderful mission and didn't want it to end. Steve Angrisano speaking at the weekend Masses helped increase attendance. Well worth the effort. It reached all age levels. Ways to improve – Have some type of medical help available. Have parking for the handicapped or for those who need to be close to the building. Have a team to aid people crossing the road from the school parking lot. Have small group discussion and/or study guides for follow-up.

Fr. Tim's Sabbatical – Discussed how things are going within the parish in Fr. Tim's absence. Consensus was that we miss Fr. Tim's presence, but things are continuing on track. Good feedback on Fr. Gary and Fr. Ted and we appreciate their service to the parish.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Once a man came to the Vatican and asked to see Pope John Paul II, claiming that they had been friends in Poland. When told of the man, the Pope said, "He is mistaken about our friendship. I don't recall ever having suffered with him." As it turned out, the man had never known the Pope. Now, I'm not sure if the story is totally factual. But doesn't the juxtaposition of *suffering* with *friendship* sound exactly like JPII? He understood that the deepest and most lasting friendships are forged in the fires of shared suffering. No suffering, no friendship. Amazing.

This week we hear Jesus say to the apostles and to us, "You are my friends if you do what I command you" (John 15:14). In Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love, to lay down our lives for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens our friendship with Him. His suffering is ours; ours is His. We have become friends of God.

This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen Jesus? How might he be sharing his suffering with you, in the lives of those around you? Be attentive to that, and you'll find that you are indeed a friend of God, because you've suffered together a great deal.
