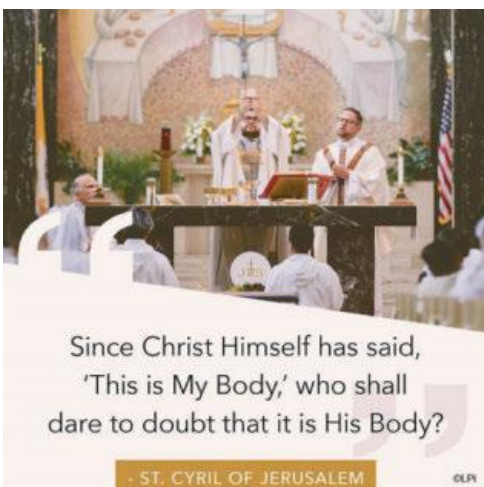

Every three years an on-site audit is conducted, when not only all necessary documentation is dutifully submitted, but in addition, Pastoral Center, parish and diocesan school employees are interviewed concerning practices and protocols related to creating and maintaining a safe environment for our children and youth.

The last 3-year audit was conducted in October of 2021. The next on-site audit will be conducted in September of 2024.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse that has been committed by a cleric or by any personnel of the Catholic Church, you are urged to report the abuse to your local police department, Children Services, and the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at (419) 214-4880; or by mail at 1933 Spielbusch Avenue; Toledo, Ohio 43604.

Deacon Travis Kahle

My name is Travis Kahle and my home parish is St. Mary's in Bluffton. I grew up in a Catholic household and am the oldest of three siblings. I graduated from Pandora-Gilboa High School in 2005 and studied Philosophy at St. Joseph's College (IN). After college I spent a few years in Columbus, OH working a few different jobs including as a musician. In 2014, I returned home to help care for my father in his last year battling with ALS. During this time, I experienced a reinvigoration of my faith life and began seriously discerning the priesthood. I completed an MA in Healthcare Mission Leadership from Loyola University Chicago and got some experience with hospital chaplaincy at Mercy Health in Lima while also leading the high school youth ministry at my home parish. I began my seminary studies in Cincinnati in 2018 and God has blessed me immensely since then. I am so grateful to our Lord for the great gift of calling me to this vocation and to our diocese for supporting me in my formation. The many prayers of the faithful in our diocese who love and support the priesthood have won for me much grace and help along my journey. Blessed Mother, intercede for us and draw us closer to the heart of our savior Jesus Christ!



Deacon Eric Kaufman

My name is Eric Kaufman, and my home parish is St. John the Baptist in Glandorf. From an early age a strong work ethic, caring for others, and the spirit of volunteerism in giving back for the greater good was instilled in me. It was these values, along with the love from family and the community, and the physical and spiritual beauty of the Catholic faith, that my Catholic faith and love for Christ grew.

After graduating high school and then receiving a degree in Computer Aided Design (CAD), I started working for PRO-TEC Coating Company in Leipsic. It was now in my twenties that I gave back even more to the parish and community. From serving on the Parish Council, heading our Capital Campaign Committee, the parish history committee, and the liturgical decorating group, to being a member of the Ottawa-Glandorf Jaycees, Glandorf Lions Club, and serving on the Glandorf Village Council for four and a half years, until I entered the seminary at the age of thirty.

I am currently enrolled in theology studies at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati. Throughout my time in discernment and formation, Mary, especially under her title of Our Lady of Mt. Deacon Kevin McGraw

Hello! I am from Elida, Ohio and my home parish is St. Charles Borromeo in Lima. My parents are Tom and Kathy McGraw. My brother Ryan, his wife Jill, and my niece Rori live in Delaware, Ohio. I also have a sibling who died prior to birth and, please God, is in heaven. I went to Elida Local Schools through high school, graduating in 2006. I attended BGSU (Class of 2011) and while there, after having fallen out of even a minimal practice of the Faith, I had an encounter with Jesus Christ through the campus ministry of St. Thomas More University Parish and Newman Center, and the Lord transformed my life. I grew in love and in zeal for Christ and His Church.

In 2013, it seemed that the Lord may be calling me to not only priesthood, but perhaps the consecrated life as well, so I began formation to become a Redemptorist priest. However, in 2019, the Lord led me out of Redemptorist formation, and I began working as an associate campus minister at the Catholic Campus Ministry serving the University of Mary Washington in Fredericksburg, Virginia. My discernment continued there for the next two years. In 2021, on the Memorial of St. Thomas Aquinas (Jan 28), I began the process and on the Memorial of St. Catherine of Siena (April 29), I became a seminarian affiliated with the Diocese of Toledo. In August 2021, I started at Theology II at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati.

In my years of seminary formation, I have strived to respond generously to the Lord's call, and I am happy where He has led! I am grateful for your prayers and support upon ordination as a transitional deacon and moving towards priestly ordination next year!

New Festival Positions Available for Individuals or Families

Since 1927, the traditional St. Boniface Festival, now All Saints Festival, has brought the community and surrounding areas together to enjoy delicious food and participate in many enjoyable activities while raising money for the parish.

We are blessed with many hard workers for festival week set up and workers on the day of the festival. However, there are many other opportunities to be involved so we are asking people to give some time to the festival preparations. To help lighten the load, we have divided some of the duties into smaller portions. Please consider serving one of the following positions.

Entertainment:

- Get a band for Saturday night entertainment
- Arrange a lineup for Sunday entertainment

Truck raffle:

- Make contact with Reinecke to get a truck.
- Pick up truck on Saturday of festival
- Return truck on Monday after festival
- If inclined to do so, purchase the items to fill the truck (you will be reimbursed)
- Fill the truck with groceries and paper items on the day of the festival

Snow Fence:

- Take charge of setting up the perimeter around the beer garden for Saturday night and move to position for Sunday festivities

Rallyup online:

- Set up new raffle on the computer just a matter of copying, changing some details and adding new pictures
- Answer questions that may be asked through Rallyup
- On Saturday, print tickets from Rallyup since we draw from a tumbler and combine with the purchased paper tickets
- Print on labels and apply to paper tickets -OR- copy by hand to paper tickets
- On Sunday, print or copy remaining tickets from Rallyup to add to tumbler

Facebook, All Saints Festival New Riegel:

- Generate promotion of our festival by posting pictures and videos
- Keep the Rallyup prize and Silent Auction pinned to the top
- Answers questions if asked through Facebook
- Continue to promote festival with updates of pictures and videos

Raffle ticket distribution:

- Organize to pass out envelopes of tickets at All Saints.
- The office has the envelopes already filled & labeled
- Set up in boxes alphabetically and have a few volunteers help with passing tickets out, for two weekends after Masses
- Have Father announce that the tickets are available for pick up it will save postage. If they don't pick them up, they get mailed

Selling raffle tickets at other churches:

- Make contact through email or a phone call with St. Mary, St. Joseph and St. Wendelin to coordinate a weekend that works for them.
- Organize people to sell tickets at each Mass.
- Have table, pens, money and tickets available for your volunteers.

Trash cans:

- Logical setup of where the trash cans should be situated
 - Such as more by the food and drink areas
- Have the trash cans clearly marked on the outside, not just the top
- Occasionally check to make sure the trash is not overflowing
 - Maintenance may do this?
- Do we need to purchase more trash cans?
