


Burial of Religious and Sacred Items



Window Project Update

Church Windows - Part 8 by Deacon Greg

Bishop Thomas approved our windows Matthew 25 and Corporal Works of Mercy theme and scene request! Fr. Tim, Sr. Marcia, Dan Borer, Diana Reinhard, Bob Swartzmiller, and Diana Bouillon met with Bishop Thomas and Fr. Zach Brown on Friday, August 16. The Bishop was complimentary of our request proposal, theme, and scenes. Now that we have the Bishop's approval, we can proceed with the art design of each individual window scene.

The Windows Committee developed guiding principles, concepts, and considerations for Artistic Design. They are listed below. We will share these guiding principles with Window Creations to help them design the scene for each window.

Inspirational and educational

It is our hope that the depicted scenes call us to discipleship, stretch us, and inspire us to do more and to be more.

Depiction of men, women, children, and families of varying ages and skin color

It is our hope that any person of any skin color, age bracket, or gender will see themselves in these windows and be inspired.

Because one of the hallmarks of our parish is the many young families, it is important to include family units and people of various ages.

The inclusion of different skin tones and people who don't look like us challenges us as a predominantly white congregation.

A suggestion has been given for each window of a basic image to represent each corporal work of mercy, understanding that the artist may tweak these ideas.

Rural Heritage

Not every parishioner at All Saints is a farmer, however, we are a rural people and greatly value our rural heritage. It is our hope that our rural heritage can be incorporated into the artistic design of the windows, perhaps through the imagery of wheat (which would symbolize both the Eucharist and unity) and/or the vine and the branches.

Simplicity

It is our hope that the design will be simple and recognizable.

We also believe that the text for each corporal work of mercy on the windows along with the image will help identify the corporal work of mercy and help the scene be both educational and inspirational.

Artistic Style

It is our recommendation that the artistic style be contemporary, but not modern with a more realistic-looking Jesus rather than a "groomed" appearing Jesus.

The style will need to consider and stay in line with the images of our existing sanctuary Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary windows.

It is our hope that the windows will utilize robust colors, allow plenty of light, and not be too busy while considering that the poor do not necessarily wear robust colors.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One of the most touching YouTube videos I've ever seen is one in which a deaf woman receives new technology to heal her hearing. She hears her husband's voice for the first time — and her own, too — and bursts into tears of overwhelming joy. It must have been like an immovable wall between her and her loved ones came tumbling down.

We are all like this woman, to some degree. We believe in the presence of God's love, but we can't hear Him. We can't speak well about Him. The deaf man who can't speak properly in the Gospel today is an image of what God wants us to experience again and again. Jesus takes the man aside to a private place away from the crowd, touches his ears and tongue, and says, "Ephphata!" The man's ears are opened, and he speaks clearly. Contact with Christ has this effect on us.

This experience happens to us in our baptism, almost exactly. It happens to us in the liturgy. It happens in our private prayer. It happens when we hear the voice of God in our conscience. The more we engage these privileged channels of Jesus' healing, the more we are empowered to hear and speak of the presence of God's perfect love.
