


for the Diocese of Cincinnati. We rejoice in his willingness to consider a life of ordained priestly service!





#### 2024 Century Farm Award Applications Available



The meeting began with "How Can I Pray For You" faith sharing.

**Council Purpose and Structure** - With all the hard work on parish buildings, relegation and demolition complete as well as the fact that some have been serving on the Council for a long time, it is time to have discussions about the purpose and structure, and membership of a pastoral council.

Fr. Tim provided everyone with copies of the <u>Diocese of Toledo Guidelines for Pastoral Councils</u>, a "Parish Life Assessment Tool" and an article on <u>Ten Tips for Effective Parish Meetings</u>. The Council will review and discuss these documents during upcoming meetings.

Discussions included the following topics:

- Council Purpose The migration from a parish council to a pastoral council as suggested by Vatican II. The Pastoral Council is not a governing body. They are intended to assist the Parish Leadership Team in identifying and prioritizing areas of need, and then to study and evaluate individual areas, making recommendations to the pastor.
- How to invite new Council members Discussed various ideas and options for nominating and selecting new members. The Council needs people who are big picture oriented and willing to guide and assist Parish Leadership Team. Pastoral Council members are appointed rather than elected. The Council will continue this discussion at future meetings.
- The number of members and terms Discussed how to involve the Finance Council in the work of the Pastoral Council. Fr. Tim asked each Pastoral Council member to discern and contemplate whether they continue to feel called by God to service to the parish as Pastoral Council members. Discussed the number of members, (7 - 12 ?) composition, involvement of all age groups, term limits and how to stagger terms.

Parish Assembly – Briefly discussed the assembly, involvement of the Council and the vision of synodality.

**Windows Project Update** – Updated the Council on the Bishop's approval of the recommended theme and scenes, next steps with Window Creations, window art design process and parish communication plans.

The meeting ended with a closing prayer.

# Dignity of the Human Person

★

In their statement on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the Catholic bishops of the United States identify the four main principles of the Church's social teaching and apply them to some concrete issues. This is not to tell the faithful for whom or against whom to vote, but instead to help them form their consciences in accordance with God's truth as they approach this oftenchallenging decision. The four main principles are the Dignity of the Human Person, the Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity. They are all interrelated. This bulletin focuses on the **Dignity of the Human Person**, and the other three principles are covered in three other bulletins in this series.

Because each human person is created in the image and likeness of God, each one of us possesses innate and inviolable human dignity. This dignity is present in each person from the moment of their conception and throughout their lives. As Pope Francis has emphasized, human dignity is central to building a society in which we are "brothers and sisters all."

"The dignity of the human person is the foundation for a moral vision of society."



Every human being has the right to live with dignity and to develop integrally; this fundamental right cannot be denied by any country. People have this right even if they are unproductive, or were born with or developed limitations. This does not detract from their great dignity as human persons, a dignity based not on circumstances but on the intrinsic worth of their being. Unless this basic principle is upheld, there will be no future either for fraternity or for the survival of humanity.<sup>2</sup>

#### Pope Francis, Fratelli Tutti, no. 107

The dignity of the human person is the foundation for a moral vision of society. As we seek to imitate the Good Samaritan and become neighbor to all, we must work to protect the dignity of all, especially those who are most vulnerable.

As we engage in the public square with a wellformed conscience:

• We work to protect the most vulnerable—children in the womb who are in danger of abortion—while also standing in radical solidarity with mothers.<sup>3</sup> Building on their bond of flesh and kinship, and on the network of family, neighbor, and community relationships in which they are situated, the Church actively assists mothers and their children to have a brighter future.

# Facebook: New Riegel All Saints Parish

- We continue to protect the dignity of our sister or brother who is elderly, disabled, or ill by strongly rejecting euthanasia and assisted suicide. These practices are symptoms of a "throwaway culture," in which children of God of inestimable worth are cast aside as worthless.<sup>4</sup>
- Likewise, we must recognize the inherent dignity of the migrant and refugee. In our country now, that means comprehensive immigration reform that offers a path to citizenship, treats immigrant workers fairly, prevents the separation of families, maintains the integrity of our borders, respects the rule of law, and addresses the factors that compel people to leave their own countries.
- We support the dignity of the person, created male or female; therefore, we oppose a gender ideology that fails to recognize the difference and reciprocity between man and woman.<sup>5</sup>
- Racism attacks the dignity of the human person by denying that we are all equally made in the image of God, so we must overcome racism in our hearts as well as in our systems and institutions.<sup>6</sup>
- We continue to seek reform of the criminal justice system and to end the use of the death penalty. We support common sense measures to reduce gun violence.<sup>7</sup>
- Finally, we seek to prevent and remedy any aspects of an "economy of exclusion,"<sup>8</sup> which "does not hesitate to exploit, discard, and even kill human beings,"<sup>9</sup> and to work instead toward an "economy of communion" rooted in ethical concern.<sup>10</sup>
