





Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes

September 17, 2024

The meeting began with "How Can I Pray For You" faith sharing.

Reviewed minutes for the August 20, 2024 meeting.

Council Purpose and Structure

- After many years of service, Margaret Steyer and John Gabel are stepping away from serving on the Pastoral Council. Both believe that with the completion of the building demolition and land sales, it is the right time to step away and make room for others to serve on the Council. Fr. Tim and all expressed their gratitude to Margaret and John for their many years of dedicated service to the parish.
- Allen Reinhart expressed his desire to continue serving on the Council. Fr. Tim and Deacon Greg will contact the other members to find out their intentions.
- Since Allen and John were not at the last meeting, Council reviewed items from the last meeting. Additional discussion took place, and feedback was received from all present related to the number of Council members, terms, number of meetings, process for nominating and discerning new members, Council purpose, desired qualities for members of Council and representation from Finance Council, parish leadership and parish high school youth.

~The key to the process for getting new Council members is discernment. If we use a nomination process, people may nominate themselves or others for consideration to be members of council. Those nominated need to discern whether they're interested in serving on the Council and willing to follow the purpose and structure of the Council based on the Diocese's Guidelines for Pastoral Councils. Finally, discernment is needed as to who best fits the Council's needs for studying, visioning, and developing the direction for the parish.

The next meeting is set for Tuesday, October 22, 2024, at 7:15PM in the Emmaus Room. The focus of the meeting will be reviewing and discussing Chapters 1 and 2 and Appendices D and E of the Guidelines for Pastoral Councils document.

The meeting ended with a closing prayer.



FATHER RYAN STAWAISZ

HEROIC SERVICE IN HIS FINAL DAYS

Chortly before his ordination, Ryan Stawaisz received a devastating Ocancer diagnosis—his second one after successfully beating cancer as a junior in college.

Despite his diagnosis, Fr. Ryan began his priestly ministry at Prince of Peace in Houston in 2019. Just two years later, on June 21, 2021, the young priest passed away, leaving a lasting impact on his parishioners, many of whom attested to his tremendous witness.

Those who knew Fr. Ryan were deeply touched by his selfless ministry, even in his final days as a priest-so much so that he has inspired a film about his life.

His brother Ross Stawaisz says he hopes Fr. Ryan's story will show the "need to stand up for some things. You need to live your life in a way that emulates Christ."

Fr. Ryan's mother, Susan Stawaisz, said she has heard from several cancer patients on how the movie has touched them: "I feel like anybody who's gone through any kind of suffering can relate to offering up your suffering and suffering heroically."

In the months leading up to the National Eucharistic Congress, Serra International raised more than \$150,000 to sponsor the presence of more than 50 religious communities.

RECENTLY ORDAINED PRIESTS

ORIGINS of PRIESTHOOD

Pope Francis has emphasized that seminarians must be "men of communion" who arise organically from the communities they serve, then return after seminary to minister even more profoundly.

That vision is slowly becoming a reality in the U.S., with most of the priests ordained in 2024 reporting active involvement in their parishes and schools.

According to CARA's recent study of men ordained in 2024, the average age at which they first considered the priesthood was 16. Between 32% and 42% went to a Catholic elementary school, high school, or college. About 60% obtained college degrees before seminary, and 70% had full-time work experience. A full 75% reported regularly participating in Eucharistic Adoration before entering priestly formation.






SMALL GROUPS

DEEP DISCERNMENT

The Melchizedek Project, a longstanding program that starts priesthood discernment groups for young men, was re-launched this summer with a new format. FATHER-SON SEMINARY TRIP

"I dream of a day when young men enter seminary, not *looking* for a father, but having been *brought* by their fathers," said Deacon James Keating of Omaha, who is renowned for his work in priestly formation.

About 45% of seminarians say they were discouraged by a friend or family member from considering the priesthood. And while some parents are tentatively open to the idea, many aren't thrilled about it.

But a real revival of a "vocations culture" requires that parents actively encourage their sons and daughters to seriously consider priesthood and religious life. Think about it this way: just as you would take your teen son to visit prospective colleges, why not try to arrange a visit to a seminary?
