#### Church Windows – Part 9


#### Windows design update

Over the past few months, the Windows Committee worked hard on the windows scene designs. The Committee members brainstormed to develop design concepts for each window following the design guidelines we shared with you in the Part 8 update in August. We provided the design concepts to Window Creations. From these design concepts Window Creations developed line drawings for each window. The Committee reviewed the drawings and met twice to offer suggested changes to each window scene design. Window Creations provided a colorized version for two of the windows to help the Committee members compare the colorized version to the line drawings. The Committee felt the colorized versions were stunning and beautiful. During the week of October 30, we finalized the suggested changes and provided them to Window Creations. Window Creations is in the process of updating the line drawings for the Committee's review. The Committee hopes to finalize the line drawings, schedule an appointment and meet with Bishop Thomas to seek his approval of the scene design for each window. Once Bishop Thomas approves the designs – both line and colorized versions – we can then work with Window Creations to begin manufacturing the windows. We are on their schedule to install the windows sometime in the second or third quarter of 2025. We plan to share the window scenes with you in the coming weeks.

#### Removed windows update

During October, Window Creations removed two of our existing church windows – one in the choir loft just behind the video equipment (southeast side of the choir loft) and one large window on the south side of the church. They removed these windows to allow them to get accurate measurements of these window sizes to aid them in their windows design and manufacturing. During the removal process, Window Creations and our staff found the current windows to be in as bad or worse condition than anticipated. We do not anticipate the need to remove any other windows prior to beginning the replacement process in 2025.

As we continue to surround Kylar Gillig with our prayers for healing and strength, we invite any person or family who has need for God's healing to join us in this novena prayer, as we invoke the intercession of Blessed Michael McGivney to intercede to God on our behalf.





The last 3-year audit was conducted in October of 2021. The next on-site audit will be conducted in September of 2024.



# CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

he Catholic Church teaches the fundamental importance of paying workers a living wage that allows them to meet their basic needs. Cooperative businesses are co-owned by the employees, which gives workers greater say in how the business is run, including the wages and salaries that workers earn. Those principles animate the work of the organizations creating opportunities and fighting poverty with support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).

Seed Commons is a New York City-based national network of community loan funds that make cooperative businesses easier to start and less expensive than obtaining bank loans. Based on a "nonextractive" model, Seed Commons does not require borrowers to make payments on interest or principal until they can cover operating expenses, including market-rate salaries. With support from CCHD, Seed Commons helps workers become

cooperative owners who earn living wages at companies like a Chicago-based window manufacturer, which pays \$2/hour more than it did before it became a cooperative. The employee-owners now earn not only higher wages but profit-sharing checks as well.

Your support of CCHD helps workers become worker-owners who earn living wages and establish economic roots in communities that badly need greater employment and earning opportunities. When you give to the CCHD collection, you help not only national networks like Seed Commons but also organizations working to end poverty within your diocese, where 25% of your contribution stays to create opportunities in your own neighborhood.

## Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently moved into a new neighborhood. On my first evening I went grocery shopping and could not find my usual favorite Greek yogurt. Strangely, my heart started to race. All the losses of my previous life hit me. So many of my old friends, habits, comforts, and predictable experiences had fallen away. There I stood, a grown man, crying like a little boy whose world was falling apart in the dairy aisle.

This week, Jesus describes what to do when one world ends, and another begins. Does it apply to the end of time? Yes. Does it apply to the end of our individual lives? Yes. It also applies to every "world" we inhabit throughout our lives, in school, family, friendships, work, play and so on. First, the sun, moon, and stars fall. The old, familiar ways of running things suddenly stop working. Light fades. Things fall apart. It's awful. But, second, Christ comes "in the clouds." Jesus, the Son of Man, replaces those old powers with himself as the prime governing principle. Third, he sends out his angels to "gather his elect from the four winds." He re-integrates the fragments into a new integrated whole. "Summer is near," he concludes. A new world begins.

Is your world crumbling? Are your sun, moon, and stars falling from the sky? Learn to discern the pattern of the Cross and Resurrection at work in it. This is the power we touch in the Mass. Jesus is coming precisely in this transition from the old to the new world. It doesn't make our losses easy. But it does make it possible to glimpse the dawning of a summer, a new beginning, the life of the world to come.

- ~Contact the priest or deacon at least six months prior to the wedding, and before securing a hall.
- ~Weddings will not be celebrated during Advent or Lent.
