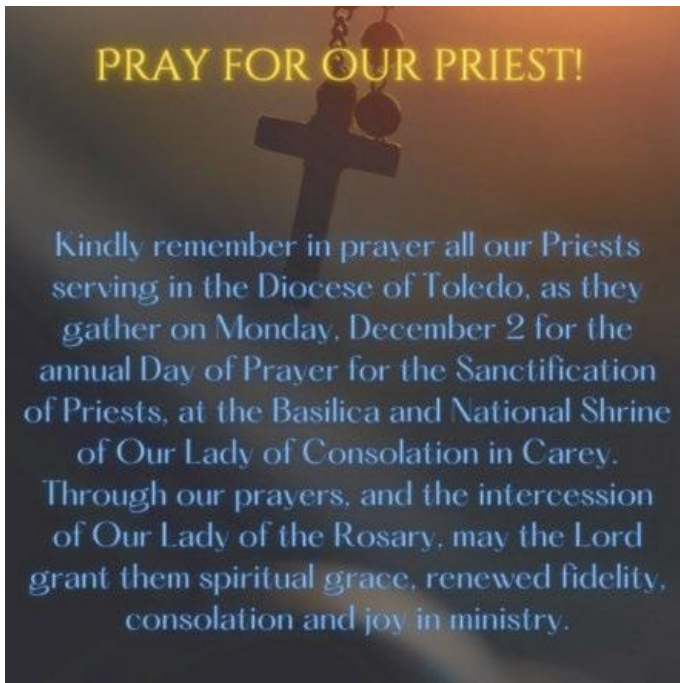

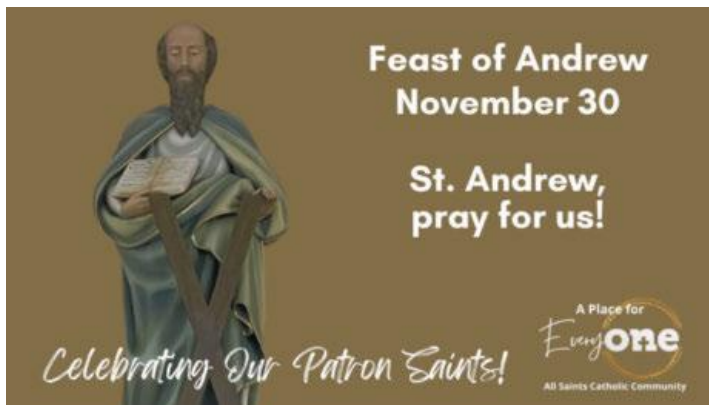

The Transformation Life Center is a resource in Seneca County aimed at assisting men, women, and families who are homeless regardless of circumstance. Provision will be made in the facility for separate accommodations for each group of the homeless. The Transformation Life Center will be able to help individuals get back on their feet by offering up to 90 days of safety net services and case management. Needs assessments will be done on families or individuals to gain an understanding of what has led to their current state of homelessness, and then an action plan will be created to address those issues. While cooperation with the

action plan is not mandatory, any stay beyond the initial 30 days is predicated upon action plan progress.

The mission of the Transformation Life Center is to create an infrastructure and culture that will transform people's lives from dependency to self-sufficiency. It will leverage partnerships with community stakeholders including businesses, government entities, educational institutions, faith-based and not-for-profit organizations, and caring community members to help families and individuals become independent once again.

First Step provides safety, shelter, and services to victims of domestic violence through community resources and collaboration. All services to victims are free of charge. We provide victims with a safe, calming environment where they can begin to heal, understand their own worth and rebuild their lives so they may live abuse free. In addition, we provide support services such as court accompaniment, life skills, 24/7 hotline support, protection order assistance, prevention education, and referrals for therapy and permanent housing. First Step serves victims in the four-county area of Seneca, Sandusky, Wyandot and Wood.

First Step is supported by local and state grants, local United Way organizations and generous donors. We are so thankful for all our donors whose generosity makes a difference every day. When you help First Step you are helping victims of abuse take control of their own lives, and take that “first step” to becoming a survivor!

First Call for Help (FCFH), a program of the Tiffin-Seneca United Way, provides direct information and referral services to the residents of Tiffin and Seneca County. The main objective of First Call for Help is to guide people to the appropriate services where they can find the help they need. Knowing here to turn when you need help is crucial period FCFH is a carefully monitored program that families and people can turn to when help is crucial FCFH is able to advise clients about programs to assist the families/clients. First Call for Help has launched 2-1-1 services for Seneca County. This three-digit phone number provides 24/7 access to trained associates who will provide referrals to appropriate services.

FCFH administers several financial assistance programs, when funding is available, including utility assistance, rental assistance, school supplies for the needy children, help for low-income senior citizens, and temporary emergency shelter.

An example of people who benefit are those working low-income jobs, the working poor. The family is trying to make ends meet but need your donated gifts cards to purchase gas to go to work or buy perishable food items, such as milk etc. to feed their families. FCFH strives to meet short-term needs and connects clients with programs that can help them become self-sufficient and break the cycle of poverty.



The Morrison House has been open and serving the homeless population in Seneca County since December 5, 2012, helping to assist as many as 17 individuals at any point in time. We provide a safe haven for women and children for a period of up to 180 days and rely heavily on donations from the community for food and other supplies. All residents are required to participate in ongoing programs to help re-establish themselves in the community as productive citizens. It is the goal of The Morrison House for each individual to have successfully acquired a job and found independent housing by completion of their stay.



Sisters in Shelter is a non-profit organization in Tiffin, that supports survivors and illuminates the atrocities of human trafficking through community education and advocacy. Our safe house serves adult female survivors of human trafficking and provides critical first needs for those survivors such as emergency safe housing, medical care, safety planning, and legal advocacy; and offering essential resources and educational support. We invite the community to join us in our mission. There are several ways you can get involved, from volunteering your time to making a donation. Together, we can make a difference and create a world where human trafficking is eradicated, and every person is treated with dignity and respect. Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a young boy in Burlington, Vermont, my dad had a good friend named Phil who owned a sporting goods store. I loved sports, so meandering the treasure-filled aisles was an unmitigated joy. One afternoon, we were shopping for a baseball glove. Dad said to me, "Hey Johnny, see that man who just walked into the store? That's Phil." I remember being fascinated and a little terrified. I recall thinking, "That man right there is in charge of everything in this store!" He reigned over every ball, sneaker, jersey, and sweatsuit. Phil became a family friend. And he was a good owner. The store flourished, and I found myself even more at peace every time I went there. I felt a new hope and even responsibility for the store to flourish.

To say that Christ is the King of the Universe means that Jesus has absolute authority over everything in it. It should fill us with awe and fascination. He is in charge. The world and everything in it are finally his. Knowing that he knows and loves us should make us also feel a deep peace at being a part of his universe. This leads us to want his kingdom to flourish, to play some responsible role in it.

We advance his kingdom by promoting the truth. **"Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice,"** Christ the King proclaims. In Phil's store, it was about the truth of athletics. In our world, it's all about the truth of all creation, especially the dignity of the human person, made by and for our loving God. Let's rejoice that we know the true king and commit to the flourishing of his kingdom.
