





Pastoral Council Meeting

October 22, 2024, Start: 7:15pm End: 9:00 PM

Attendance – <u>Present</u>: Allen Reinhart, Alicia Swartzmiller, Bob Swartzmiller (Finance Council), Brad Zoeller (Finance Council, Deacon Greg (ex oficio) and Fr. Tim (ex oficio). <u>Not able to attend</u>: Tim Kimmet.

The meeting began with "How Can I Pray For You" faith sharing.

Reviewed minutes for the September 17, 2024, meeting.

Council Purpose and Structure

- Joe Coleman, Lucas Brickner and Tim Galvin are stepping away from serving on the Pastoral Council. With the completion of the building demolition and land sales, they believe it is the right time to step away and make room for others to serve on the Council. Fr. Tim and all expressed their gratitude to Joe, Lucas and Tim for their years of dedicated service to the parish.
- Tim Kimmet expressed his desire to continue serving on the Council but could not attend this meeting.
- Council will decide on Finance Council representation going forward. Parish leadership will participate as needed.
- Fr. Tim and Deacon Greg provided the Council with a church windows update.
- Briefly discussed two documents produced and provided by the Diocese: "Seven Disciplines of Healthy Parishes"
 and "A Vision of a Healthy Parish". The Council will discuss these documents in more detail at a future meeting.
- Watched and discussed the **Work of Pastoral Council** PowerPoint. The presentation covered the origins of the pastoral council, qualities of council members, the Council's role as a consulting body and Council's three-fold task of: 1) Investigating, 2) Reflecting, and 3) Recommending. The three-fold task is conducted under the authority and direction of the Pastor (or Pastoral Leader) and deal with the pastoral work of the parish. The Council representatives "make present" to the pastor the wisdom of the parish community to help him in his pastoral work for the parish.
- Discussed options we may use to surface names of parishioners to possibly serve as representatives on the Council, their terms (how to stagger terms), how to help individuals discern whether being a council member is right for them and for the parish. Fr. Tim and the Council agree the Work of the Pastoral Council PowerPoint is a good tool to use in helping individuals discern their possible participation on the Council. Opportunities for parishioners to nominate people for consideration for the Council will take place during weekend Masses the weekends of November 10 and 17. Current Council members will contact the nominated individuals to determine their interest. Informational and discernment meetings are planned for December 7 at 1 PM and December 10 and 7 PM.

The next meeting is set for Tuesday, November 19, at 7:15PM in the Emmaus Room. The focus of the meeting will be reviewing Council nominations, the Council selection process and the "Seven Disciplines of a Healthy Parish" document.

The meeting ended with a closing prayer.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was a young priest, about one year after ordination, I was called to the hospital to anoint a dying mother of three young children. She had a painful, terminal cancer. After celebrating Last Rites with her, I said, "Don't be afraid." She looked me square in the eye from her hospital bed and said, "Oh Father, I am in a lot of pain, but I am not afraid. Something wonderful is about to happen." A few days later she died.

Christians face the ending of our personal various "worlds" in a totally unique way. This first Sunday of Advent, Jesus says that when people see their world falling apart, they find themselves "fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world" (Luke 21:26). In our fear, our natural response is to check out, to hide our heads in drunkenness, distraction, and false securities. But Jesus commands us to "look up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." He then compares what's coming to a lovely summer in full bloom. That's what the cross and resurrection empower us to do, as strange as it may seem.

Advent challenge: What world in your life is collapsing? A relationship, a dream, a work opportunity? Maybe you're troubled by a crumbling world in the political or economic sphere. Or maybe someone you love is seriously ill or dying. Name that world or worlds. Then pray: "Lord, help me to not faint with fear. Help me to raise my head and see your redemption coming."
