Pastoral Council Meeting

19 November 2024, Start: 7:30pm End: 8:45 PM

Attendance – <u>Present</u>: Allen Reinhart, Alicia Swartzmiller, Tim Kimmet, Fr. Tim and Deacon Greg (ex oficio). <u>Not able to attend</u>: None

The meeting began with a prayer.

Review of minutes for the October 22, 2024, meeting took place via email.

Review and discussion of Nominations and nomination/discernment process

- Fr. Tim reviewed the nomination process and nominations received at the November 10 and 17 weekend Masses. At each weekend Mass, parishioners were encouraged to submit names for consideration for the Parish Council (the Council). Twenty-four candidates were nominated. One additional candidate expressed interest in being on the Council through the recent Stewardship survey.
 - Council members, Fr. Tim and Dcn. Greg will contact each nominee to gauge their interest in continuing with the discernment process. If a candidate is interested in being considered, the Candidate will choose which discernment session they plan to attend.
- The Council has two scheduled discernment sessions: December 7 @ 1PM and December 10 @ 7:15PM. Candidates interested in discerning becoming a member of the Council need to attend one of the two meetings. These sessions will include reviewing the **Work of Pastoral Council** PowerPoint, past and current members sharing their experiences being on the Council, and time for candidate discernment. From this meeting, the candidates will prayerfully discern whether they wish to continue being a candidate for the Council.
- The Council is looking to add five or six new members. The Council may consider more members once they know the number of candidates who discern they wish to continue being considered for the Council.
 - The Council wishes to have a good balance in membership. Balance between women and men, balance in ages, balance in location within the parish and balance in skills, gifts, talents and charisms.
- Fr. Tim shared and the Council reviewed a draft discernment meeting agenda. The Council also discussed how to proceed with an additional discernment meeting if one is needed due to the number of candidates being considered.
- The Council discussed whether future meetings should be monthly or at some other frequency and day of the week. Meetings are currently the third Tuesday of the month. The Council will discern what's best once all new members are in place.

The next meeting is set for Tuesday, December 17, at 7:15PM in the Emmaus Room. The focus of the meeting will focus on the Council selection process, determining if an additional discernment meeting is needed and possibly selecting Council members.

The meeting ended with a closing prayer.

Colin Reinhart – FOCUS Missionary Colin Reinhart, parishioner and son of Irvin and Amy Reinhart, is dedicating the next three years of his life as a missionary for the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS). Colin's full-time job will be spreading the Gospel and helping lead young people on college campuses to a stronger relationship with the Lord. FOCUS missionaries are responsible for privately raising their own salaries, so each missionary relies on the charity of many others to make possible their mission on college campuses. Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

On a bright Spring morning, a passerby once saw St. Francis of Assisi hoeing a row of beans and asked him, "What would you be doing right now if you knew this was the last day of your earthly life?" The Saint responded, "I'd keep hoeing this row of beans." Preparing for this world to end — whether by our death or by Jesus' glorious coming — invites us to live not in the past or the present, but deeply in the present moment.

This same point is on display in the simple advice given by the wild and eccentric John the Baptist. He speaks of the one who is to come who will baptize "with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). Despite the bizarre awesomeness of this announcement, he tells his listeners to engage in the present moment with simple acts of justice and love as their preparation for Jesus' coming, sharing their clothes and food, eliminating greedy and underhanded practices, being content with their wages. It's so undramatic. But how many actually did it? We don't know. How many of us will commit ourselves to these types of humble and demanding practices in our lives? That's what we should be doing now in our present moment, not worrying about the future.

Advent challenge: Name one way you are doing the bare minimum towards others in your daily life. Or name something you are doing because you are not content with your financial situation. Pray: "Jesus, if it is your will, help me to stop doing these things this week. Help me prepare for your coming." Then make the appropriate changes.
