
THANK YOU

New Art Glass Windows

Installation: Summer/Fall 2025

Theme: Matthew 25:31-46
The Last Judgement
and the Corporal Works of Mercy

Design for the Top of Each Window

- The design for the top of each window is consistent for each window and thematically ties the windows together as we progress window by window through theme and scriptural scenes.
- Shocks of wheat appear at the bottom right and left of the light blue colored circular section of the top of each window. The wheat shocks, tied in deep blue, are one representation of our rural agricultural heritage. They also represent the grains of wheat from John 12:24 that fall to the earth and die and bear much fruit. Most importantly, the wheat shocks represent the Holy Eucharist made of bread of finest wheat.
- Grape vine branches appear just above the archway in each window. The grape vines tie each window to the other and to the grape vine trim of the side sanctuary windows. The grape vines branches represent the relationship Jesus and each of us with Jesus being the vine and each of us being the branches. Most importantly, the grapes represent the fruit of the vine that becomes our spiritual drink in the form of wine, consecrated as the blood of Christ in the Eucharist of the Mass.

Window #13: Matthew 25:31-34 The Last Judgement

The image depicts Christ seated on the throne, separating the goats from the sheep. The width of the window did not allow for the depiction of the goats on the left and the sheep on the right. Therefore, the sheep are depicted in the foreground with the goats in the background. There is a chasm depicted in between Jesus and the goats. The sheep are also clearly distinguished from the goats, as the horns of the goats are quite noticeable.

Jesus is depicted as a King on a throne in contrast to Jesus as the Good Shepherd as is often represented. Jesus' hands are welcoming, gesturing to the sheep.

Window Theme: Matthew 25:31-46 The Final Judgement and the Corporal Works of Mercy

Reasons for Choosing Theme

- The theme is scriptural. In Matthew 25, Jesus sets before the Church the pathway to heaven, the criteria for being judged worthy to entrance to everlasting life.
- The theme is timeless, always relevant, and not identified with one specific saint, culture, or period of time.
- The theme reflects the universal call to holiness and leads to the eternal.
- The theme is straightforward, with something to encourage and inspire everyone.

Guiding Principles of Artistic Design Inspirational and educational

 It is our hope that the depicted scenes call us to discipleship, stretch us, and inspire us to do more and to be more.

Depiction of men, women, children, and families of varying ages and nationalities

- It is our hope that any person of any skin color, age bracket, or gender will see themselves in these windows and be inspired.
- Because one of the hallmarks of our parish is the many young families, it is important to include family units and people of various ages.
- The inclusion of different skin tones and people who don't look like us challenges us as a predominantly white congregation.

Rural Heritage

- Not every parishioner at All Saints is a farmer, however, we are rural people and greatly value our rural heritage.
- Our rural heritage is depicted through imagery of wheat, which symbolizes both the Eucharist and unity, and the vine and the branches.

Simplicity

- The goal was that each design be simple and recognizable.
- The text for each corporal work of mercy is included along with the image for both educational and inspirational purposes.

Artistic Style

- The style is contemporary, but not modern with a more realistic-looking Jesus rather than a "groomed" appearing Jesus, staying in line with the current images of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- The use of robust colors, allowing plenty of light, and not be too busy while considering that the poor do not necessarily wear robust colors.

Window Committee Members

Window #12 Matthew 25:35a Feed The Hungry

In each corporal work of mercy, one or more persons is depicted as "giving" and one or more as "receiving." It was important to that there be an equal representation of different people in this role, i.e. a black person giving and a white person receiving.

This image of *Feed the Hungry* depicts a black woman and perhaps her daughter sharing food with an elderly man and perhaps his grandson.

The expressions on the faces of the people show the various emotions associated with this work of mercy. The woman is happy to be visiting and sharing, while her daughter looks a bit more reticent.

The elderly man is reaching his hand out to accept the food from the young girl but looks a bit reticent as well. The young boy is sharing of what he has been given as well. He has one apple in hand and is reaching up to share the other apple with the elderly man, depicting that those who receive also are called to share with others.

The artistic design of this scene is simple, inspirational and educational.



Window #11: Matthew 25:35b Give Drink to the Thirsty

The image depicts people of color, perhaps in Africa. The two young boys, perhaps brothers, are depicted in what would be a typical pattern for African boys sharing water from a jug. The older boy is the "giver" while the younger boy is the "receiver." Our Committee started with a picture of the older boy sharing water, from a container, with the younger boy. The Committee really liked the picture of the two boys and decided to build the scene around these two boys.

Two women are depicted in this scene, as women are generally the ones who carry the water in African countries. One woman is seen at the bore pump. The pump and the buckets as well as the background remind us that water is precious and not always readily available like it is in our community. For many of our global brothers and sisters, getting water to meet their needs requires great effort.

The inclusion of a scene from an African village reminds us that we are called to give drink to the thirsty both locally and globally.

This scene includes young boys and women of differing ages. The woman at the pump appears younger than the other woman. The scene shows the intergenerational nature of a community.
