



Pastoral Council Meeting

18-Nov-2025, Start: 7:15pm End: 9:00 PM

Attendance – Pastoral Council members present: Karen Fritsch, Sr. Carol Inkrott, John Kidd, Joyce Meyer, Jayden Nye, Alicia Swartzmiller, Allen Reinhart, Gary Schalk, and ex oficio members Fr. Tim and Deacon Greg. Not able to attend: Tim Kimmet, Tom Wise, and Luke Elchert.

Luke Elchert discerned and requested to step away from the Council.

Sr. Carol served as the facilitator and led us in the prayer to the Holy Spirit that was prayed at the Second Vatican Council, then invited all to participate in a short ice breaker.

The Council studied Signpost 3, The Eucharist from the booklet **“Seven Signposts of the Second Vatican Council and of Pope Francis”** using the synodal process of listening in the Holy Spirit. Through reading, study and discussion, Council members emphasized: As baptized Christians, everything we are and everything we do together must begin at the altar of the Lord and return to the altar in prayerful thanksgiving and praise. We are all called to the full, conscious and active participation in the celebration of the liturgy, especially in the sacred scripture and the Eucharist. As Catholics we are Eucharistic people. We are people drawn to the Eucharist as the source and summit of the life of the Church (the Church which is each of us), the memorial of Christ death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of the unity of the Church, a bond of charity, the heartbeat of the church and the lifeblood of the Church. Through the liturgy – especially the scripture and the Eucharist – we are transformed into the living Body and Blood of Jesus. We need to open our souls to the grace that God bestows on us. Open our minds to a deeper understanding of the mystery that we experience in the liturgy. Open our hearts to go in the peace of Christ to love and serve the Lord and each other.

Father Tim gave a summary report including:

- Update on the annual offertory enhancement program through OSV intended to reinforce the importance of financial stewardship of the parish.
- Update on the parish hall renovations and water quality issues.
 - The renovations are nearing completion. Once completed, a cleaning crew will do a deep cleaning of the entire building as well as the church building. The maintenance team is still working on the parish hall water quality issues.
- The parish Christmas book give-away is “Talking Out of Church” by S. James Meyer.
- A two-night Parish Mission on March 8 & 9, with Paul Fahey and Monica Pope, focusing on the social teachings of the Church and the Corporal Works of Mercy.

The meeting ended with the “How Can I Pray For You” group prayer exercise.

Next meeting - Tuesday, 20 January 2026, at 7:15PM in the Emmaus Room.





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently learned why zebras have stripes. Scientists used to think it was for camouflage, but new research suggests something more interesting: the stripes help zebras blend in with one another. When a predator looks at a herd, the overlapping stripes make it hard to single out one animal. But if a researcher spray-paints a dot on just one zebra, predators lock on it and eventually attack. The lesson? In the wild, blending in is protection. Standing out can be dangerous.

Human beings are not so different. Most of us would rather blend in than stand out, especially when it comes to our faith. We know that giving bold witness to Jesus — through our words, values, or public choices — can make us targets for criticism, isolation, or judgment. That's why Jesus' words in today's Gospel are so challenging: **"You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden" (Matthew 5:14).**

A city on a hill draws attention. It also draws fire. But that's part of the cost of discipleship. Jesus doesn't call us to be tribal or boastful. He calls us to stand in the open with humble confidence, so that people might see our good deeds and glorify our Father in heaven. Today, let's ask for the courage not just to believe in Christ, but to be seen believing in him.
